1. INVITATION TO SUBMIT PROPOSALS

The Ministry of Health (MOH) invites suitably qualified and experienced individual consultants to submit proposals for the provision of **Laboratory Information Management System (LIMS) Consultancy Services** under the **TT ONE LAB+ Pandemic Fund Project**.

The Consultant will provide specialized technical support in relation to laboratory data management, cross-sector data sharing and integration, adaptation of existing LIMS systems, development of cross-sectoral data-sharing protocols and capacity building among participating stakeholders.

The successful Consultant will work closely with the Ministry of Health, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, The University of the West Indies (The UWI) St. Augustine Campus, the Trinidad Public Health Laboratory (TPHL) Project Coordinator, the TTLIMS focal point at CARPHA and relevant in-house technical teams.

2. BACKGROUND

TT ONE LAB+: Strengthening Laboratory Capacity for One Health Surveillance in Support of Pandemic Preparedness, Prevention and Response in Trinidad and Tobago is intended to strengthen disease surveillance and pandemic preparedness through an integrated **One Health** approach.

The project comprises three principal beneficiary entities:

- Ministry of Health;
- Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries; and
- The University of the West Indies, St. Augustine Campus.

The project will strengthen laboratory systems at the Trinidad Public Health Laboratory (TPHL), Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory (VDL) and The UWI, St. Augustine Campus, while addressing critical gaps in testing, genomic surveillance and data sharing.

Key components include upgrading laboratory facilities and infrastructure, integrating molecular testing across One Health sectors, developing cross-sectoral protocols and governance frameworks, developing a cross-sector data management system and strengthening national capacity through training.

The project is sponsored by the World Bank, with the World Health Organization (WHO) serving as Technical Lead, under the Pandemic Fund.

3. PURPOSE OF THE CONSULTANCY

The Ministry of Health seeks to engage a LIMS Consultant to complete specific deliverables related to **cross-sector data sharing and integration** under the TT ONE LAB+ Pandemic Fund Project.

The Consultant will assess existing systems for laboratory data management and support the implementation of cross-sector data sharing and integration to support the objectives of the TT ONE LAB+ Project.

4. OBJECTIVE OF THE CONSULTANCY

The primary objective is to strengthen laboratory data management and facilitate effective, secure and sustainable sharing of laboratory information across participating One Health institutions.

The Consultant will:

1. Assess existing LIMS, data-sharing policies and practices among partner institutions.
2. Conduct a gap analysis and identify challenges and opportunities for improved data sharing.
3. Support the adaptation and extension of the existing TTLIMS platform to facilitate utilization by the Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory and The UWI.
4. Develop cross-sectoral SOPs, policies and practices for secure and efficient data exchange.
5. Support the development of appropriately tiered access protocols.
6. Develop and standardize data collection, reporting and analysis processes.
7. Establish or support internal referral pathways among partner institutions.
8. Conduct audits to verify the functionality of adapted LIMS systems.
9. Facilitate end-user training and stakeholder capacity building.
10. Provide recommendations to promote the sustainability of cross-sectoral data-sharing arrangements.

These responsibilities are intended to bridge institutional gaps and facilitate efficient data flows across participating sectors.

5. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Consultant shall provide services including, but not limited to, the following:

5.1 Cross-Sector Laboratory Data Management and Integration

The Consultant shall:

- a. Review and analyse the existing TTLIMS, SOPs, policies and practices at partner institutions.
- b. Develop and support implementation of cross-sector SOPs, policies and practices for efficient data exchange.
- c. Ensure that data access levels are appropriately tailored to each institution's role and responsibilities.
- d. Recommend adaptations or extensions to existing LIMS systems to support cross-sector data sharing and integration.
- e. Collaborate with the TTLIMS focal point at CARPHA and in-house IT teams to implement necessary changes or extensions to the system.
- f. Support the implementation of tiered access based on institutional requirements while maintaining system interoperability.
- g. Identify events requiring information sharing and propose solutions to address gaps in existing systems.
- h. Collaborate with the TTLIMS focal point at CARPHA to establish internal referral pathways among partner institutions.
- i. Conduct audits of adapted LIMS systems to verify functionality.

5.2 Capacity Building and Stakeholder Collaboration

The Consultant shall:

- a. Facilitate training sessions, in collaboration with the TTLIMS focal point at CARPHA, for staff and stakeholders on updated systems.

b. Collaborate with the MOH, MAF and The UWI to ensure effective integration of One Health approaches into data management practices.

7. CONSULTANCY DURATION

The consultancy shall be for a period of **nine (9) months**.

8. LOCATION

The Consultant will be required to work in **Trinidad and Tobago**, including in-person/in-country engagement as required.

9. MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

9.1 Education

Essential

- Bachelor's Degree in Health Informatics, Computer Science or a related field.

Desirable

- Master's Degree in Health Informatics, Computer Science or a related field.
- Specialized training or certification in health informatics, LIMS, data science, data management or information systems.

9.2 Professional Experience

Essential

- Minimum of five (5) years' experience in data management or health informatics.

Desirable

- Experience with Laboratory Information Management Systems (LIMS).
- Experience in public health, laboratory settings or health-system integration.
- Experience with multi-institutional data-sharing projects.
- Experience conducting IT system end-user training.

9.3 Technical Skills

The Consultant should demonstrate:

- Strong understanding of LIMS and integration with other health information systems.
- Proficiency in data management and analysis tools.
- Knowledge of tiered data-sharing frameworks balancing collaboration and confidentiality.
- Familiarity with epidemiological and surveillance data management practices.

9.4 Other Competencies

- Understanding of One Health informatics challenges.

- Strong stakeholder engagement and collaboration skills.
- Excellent written and oral communication skills.
- Attention to detail.
- Ability to manage competing priorities effectively.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office Suite, including Excel and PowerPoint.

10. PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

Interested consultants shall submit a **Technical Proposal** and a **Financial Proposal**.

10.1 Technical Proposal

The Technical Proposal should include:

9. Availability for the required nine-month consultancy.
10. At least three relevant professional references.

11. PROPOSED METHODOLOGY

The Consultant should provide a clear methodology demonstrating how the objectives and deliverables will be achieved.

The methodology should address:

- Assessment of existing systems.
- Stakeholder consultations.
- Gap analysis.
- Cross-sector data-sharing requirements.
- LIMS adaptation and integration.
- Data governance and access requirements.
- Development of SOPs and policies.
- Data standardisation.

- Training and capacity building.
- System testing and functionality verification.
- Monitoring and reporting.
- Sustainability of the data-sharing arrangements.

12. FINANCIAL PROPOSAL / COST BREAKDOWN

The Consultant shall provide a detailed financial proposal. The proposed cost should be **all-inclusive**, unless otherwise specified by the Ministry.
